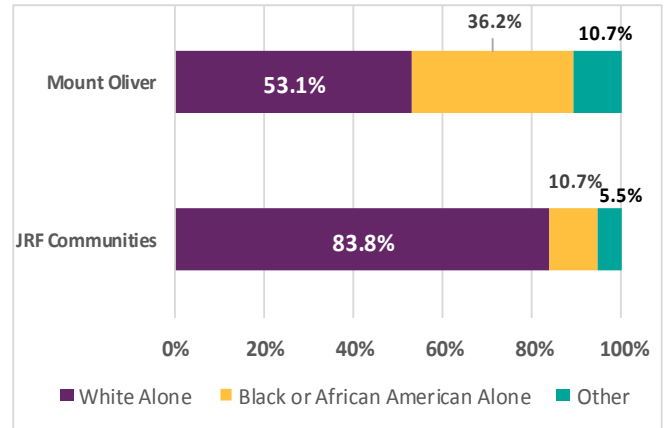

Population: 3,400

Population by Race/Ethnicity:

- As of 2014, Mount Oliver's total population was estimated at 3,400. This was a decline by 9% from a total of 10,466 reported in 2000.¹
- The racial/ethnic composition of Mount Oliver is 53.1% white, 36.2% African American and 10.7% other races.
- 9% of the total population is over age 65 — lower than the Jefferson Regional Foundation (JRF) Communities (19%) and the City of Pittsburgh (14%). Mount Oliver residents make up 59% of the population. Children under 18 account for 32% of the population—the highest percentage of all JRF Communities.
- The median age for Brentwood is 40. This is lower than Allegheny County (41) and higher than the city of Pittsburgh (33).

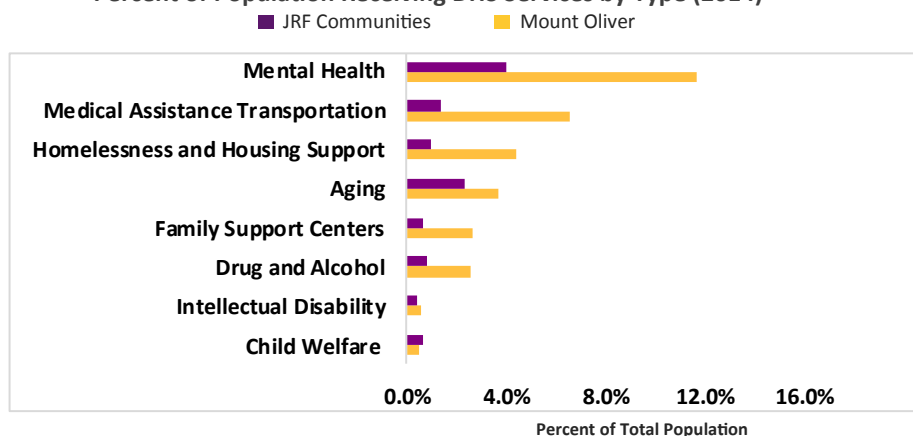

- In 2014, 1,113 residents of Mount Oliver (33% of the total population) received SNAP benefits.
