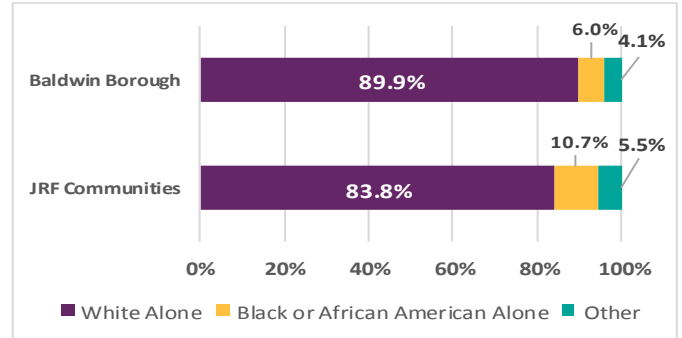

Population: 19,791

Population by Race/Ethnicity  
(2014):

- The 2014 Baldwin total population was estimated at 19,791. This is a slight decrease from 19,999 reported in 2000.<sup>1</sup>
- The racial/ethnic composition of Baldwin is 89.9% white, 6% African American and 4.1% other races.
- 19.5% of the total population is over 65, similar to the Jefferson Regional Foundation (JRF) Community average (19%) and higher than the City of Pittsburgh (14%). Baldwin residents between the ages of 18 and 64 make up 60% of the population. Children under the age of 18 account for 21% of the population.
- The median age for Baldwin is 43, similar to the JRF communities, while the city of Pittsburgh median age is 33 and has decreased since 2000.<sup>1</sup>

- In 2014, 1,060 Baldwin Borough residents (5% of the total population) received SNAP benefits.

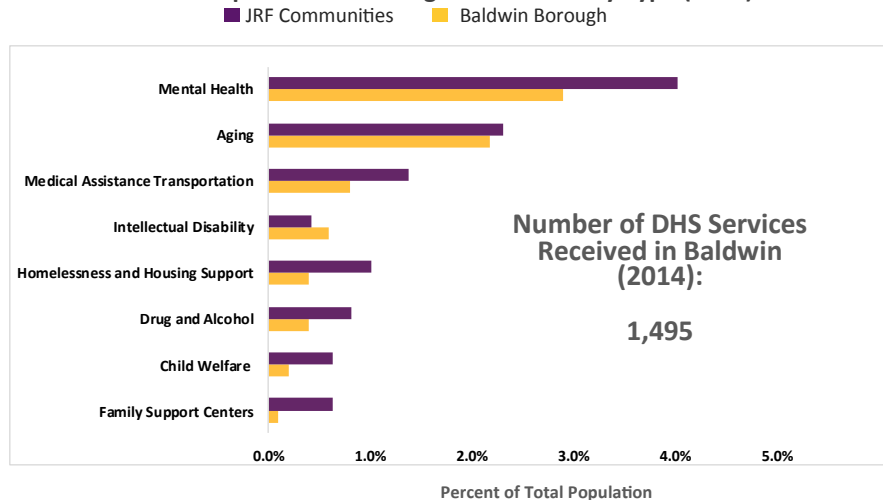
